Position of House Officer (Foundation Doctor) in the Office of the Deputy Prime Minister and Ministry for Health

Nomenclatures denoting the male gender include also the female gender.

1. The Permanent Secretary, Office of the Deputy Prime Minister and Ministry for Health invites applications for the position of House Officer (Foundation Doctor) in the Office of the Deputy Prime Minister and Ministry for Health.

Duration of assignment and Conditions

2.1 The call for the Position of House Officer (Foundation Doctor) in the Office of the Deputy Prime Minister and Ministry for Health is intended for Medical Graduates who do not hold a license or full registration as medical doctor.

2.2 A selected candidate will enter into an assignment of one hundred and six (106) weeks as a House Officer (Foundation Doctor) in the office of the Deputy Prime Minister and Ministry for Health, which may be renewed for further year and does not exceed a total of one hundred and fifty eight (158) week if the Foundation Doctor requires such extension in order to complete the Foundation Programme.

2.3 The House Officer (Foundation Doctor) is to follow the training programme with the aim of obtaining the Foundation Programme Completion Certificate (FPCC) in order to be eligible to apply for the Basic Specialist Training or General Practitioner Training. 2.4 The position of House Officer (Foundation Doctor) is subject to a probationary period of one (1) year.

2.5 Since this is a position time-barred, the position of House Officer (Foundation Doctor) constitutes an objective reason which falls under Regulation 7(4) of Subsidiary Legislation 452.81 entitled "Contracts of Service for a Fixed Term Regulations".

2.6 Selected candidates must be of conduct which is appropriate to the post/position applied for. Prior to appointment, selected candidates from outside the Public Service must produce a Certificate of Conduct issued by the Criminal Records Office or other competent authority not earlier than six (6) months from the closing date of this call for applications, which should be submitted by the selected candidate within one (1) week from the date of the notification of appointment.

2.7 In terms of the requirements emanating from Directive 16, regarding the "Governing Framework for Preventing and Managing Conflicts of Interest in the Public Administration", issued by the Principal Permanent Secretary on 27th November 2023 and which came into force on 1st February 2024, the Selection Board will assess candidates' previous employments to assess potential conflicts of interest. In this respect, candidates are to provide a completely updated CV, including qualifications and employment history with their application. Any potential conflict of interest matters noted will be reported to the respective Permanent Secretary, to ensure that should the candidate be recruited, such conflicts of interest would be appropriately managed.

Moreover, selected candidates are to report any known actual, potential or apparent conflicts of interest prior to accepting an appointment, through the prescribed Declaration available at Appendix 1 to Directive 16 (available [here](#)).

Salary pegged to the position

3.1 The Salary attached to the position of House Officer (Foundation Doctor) is equivalent to Step 5 of Salary Scale 9 (which in the year 2026 is €30,490.34 per annum).

3.2 Upon completion of one (1) year satisfactory service as Foundation Doctor, employees shall progress to the

maximum of Salary Scale 9 (which in the year 2026 is €31,385.00 per annum) .

3.3 A Foundation Trainee Specialisation Allowance of €4,100 in Year 1 and €4,550 in Year 2 which shall be paid to the House Officer (Foundation Doctor) in three-monthly instalments in arrears.

3.4 An annual Special Duty Allowance of €4,920.00 will be paid to Foundation Doctors who perform duties on roster basis. This allowance will be paid quarterly in arrears.

3.5 Foundation Doctors performing duties in these areas will not be entitled to a shift allowance.

Duties

4.1 The job duties for the position of House Officer (Foundation Doctor) may be viewed in Annex A attached to this Circular.

4.2 An appointee may be required to perform duties in any of the Health Care Services of the Government of Malta at the discretion of the Management.

Eligibility Requirements

5.1 By the closing time and date of this call for applications, applicants must be:

- i. a. citizens of Malta; **or**
- b. citizens of the other Member States of the European Union who are entitled to equal treatment to Maltese citizens in matters of employment by virtue of EU legislation and treaty provisions dealing with the free movement of workers; **or**
- c. citizens of any other country who are entitled to equal treatment to Maltese citizens in matters related to employment by virtue of the application to that country of EU legislation and treaty provisions dealing with the free movement of workers; **or**
- d. any other persons who are entitled to equal treatment to Maltese citizens in matters related to employment in terms of the law or the above-mentioned EU legislation and treaty provisions, on account of their family relationship with persons mentioned in paragraph (a), (b) or (c); **or**
- e. third country nationals who have been granted long-term resident status in Malta under regulation 4 of the "Status of Long-Term Residents (Third Country Nationals) Regulations, 2006" or who have been granted a residence permit under regulation 18(3) thereof, together with family members of such third country nationals who have been granted a residence permit under the "Family Reunification Regulations, 2007"; **or**
- f. in possession of a residence document issued in terms of the "Residence Status of United Kingdom Nationals and their Family Members in Malta in accordance with the Agreement on the Withdrawal of the United Kingdom and Northern Ireland from the European Union and the European Atomic Energy Community Regulations".

The advice of the Citizenship Unit within Community Malta Agency and the Expatriates Unit within Identity should be sought as necessary in the interpretation of the above provisions.

The appointment of candidates referred to at (b), (c), (d) and (e) above would necessitate the issue of an employment licence in so far as this is required by the Immigration Act and subsidiary legislation. Jobsplus should be consulted as necessary on this issue.

Applications will also be considered from candidates who are third-country nationals and do not satisfy the criteria set out in paragraph 5.1 (i), provided that they satisfy the requirements stated in paragraphs 5.1 (ii) to 5.3. The appointment of such candidates would necessitate the issue of an employment licence in so far as this is required by the Immigration Act and subsidiary legislation.

ii. have the ability to communicate in the English Language provided that due recognition will be given to candidates who also have the ability to communicate in the Maltese Language. Proficiency in the English Language will be accepted if applicants:

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- Provide proof that the primary medical qualification was undertaken in the English Language;

OR

- Provide a valid certificate of IELTS (International English Language Testing System) at the medium band score of 7.5 or above in each domain;

Selected candidates must demonstrate basic proficiency in the Maltese language within two (2) years of engagement. This requisite must be fulfilled by successfully passing the Basic Medical Maltese for Healthcare Professions examination, following completion of the Basic Medical Maltese Part 1 and Part 2 courses from the training institution designated by the Office of the Deputy Prime Minister and Ministry for Health.

- iii. (a) qualified with a degree in Medicine and Surgery from the University of Malta; **OR**
(b) any other basic medical qualification First Degree at MQF Level 7 with a duration of not less than five (5) years of study from an accredited medical school in an EU Member State;

The said degrees should have been awarded not earlier than **1st January 2024** and all candidates must have obtained the said qualification prior to engagement.

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- iv. (a) be listed in the Provisional Register kept by the Malta Medical Council in terms of Article 11 sub-article 3 of the Health Care Professions Act (Cap. 464 of the Laws of Malta);

OR

- iv. (b) Graduates from Universities other than the University of Malta must produce evidence in the Dean's statement referred to in paragraph 5.1(v) that they would be eligible to be considered for registration by the start of the Foundation Programme. Such candidates must also obtain a Letter of Intent from the Malta Medical Council that their qualification is registerable and which letter must be attached with the application. It is strongly advised that these candidates make direct contact with the Malta Medical Council as soon as they express their interest, to make sure that this process is concluded on time. Letters of Intent by the Malta Medical Council will not be considered if received after the dates allocated for interviews, and this will result in candidates being then deemed ineligible or disqualified from the selection process.

Doctors graduating from a non-EU Country need to check with the Malta Medical Council whether they are eligible for a provisional registration prior to applying to this Foundation Programme. They will require a letter of intent from the said Council.

Furthermore, successful candidates must inevitably obtain the said registration prior to the engagement. For ease of reference the website for the Medical Council of Malta is <https://medicalcouncil.gov.mt/en/>

- v. (i) Produce a Medical School Dean's Statement (sample available at <https://fpmalta.gov.mt/>), which is signed, dated and stamped and completed in English, which comprises:

- (a) permission to apply for the Foundation Programme in Malta;
- (b) confirmation that the applicant is of good standing at medical school and considered fit to practice Medicine;
- (c) confirmation of whether primary medical qualification (including instruction, examinations and a significant amount of clinical contact with patients) was/is being undertaken in English;
- (d) the expected date of qualification, in the case of applicants who have not yet qualified.

- (ii) A verifiable declaration from the respective medical school of the applicant's academic ranking in deciles. This document should be made available to the Malta Foundation School by the inter-view date. Where information regarding the academic ranking is inconsistent with decile grading or missing, the lowest academic score will be used.

Public officers applying for this position must be confirmed in their current appointment, unless the current appointment is in a different class/career line or in a defined position or in a lower

grade/position.

5.2 (i) Qualifications at a level higher than that specified above will be accepted for eligibility purposes, provided they meet any specified subject requirements.

(ii) Moreover, candidates who have not yet formally obtained any of the above-mentioned qualifications will still be considered. Such candidates are to submit evidence that they have been approved for the award of the qualification in question.

(iii) Furthermore, candidates who are currently following a recognised programme of study at a higher MQF level than that requested above will also be considered. Such candidates are to submit evidence that they have successfully completed the necessary ECTS credits, or equivalent, and attained the required MQF level, by the closing time and date of the call for applications.

5.3 Candidates who wish to seek eventual full registration from the Medical Council in a country other than Malta, should seek advice from the respective Medical Council as prospective approval from some of that country's institutions may be required. Persons graduating from a UK Medical School who would like to eventually seek registration with the UK General Medical Council, are advised to seek written approval from the post-graduate Dean before joining the Malta Foundation Programme.

5.4 In addition to the requirements at 5.1 above, by the start of employment and training, applicants must:

- i. be in possession of a valid recognised Basic Life Support Certificate;
- ii. show that they have understood and agreed to the minimum requirements for completion of the Foundation Programme by signing a Foundation School Training Agreement.

5.5 Successful candidates **are to attend for the pre-employment medical examination and relevant investigations in Malta**, at least two (2) weeks before taking up the position of House Officer (Foundation Doctor). Failure to undertake the pre-employment medical examination on time, will result in delays in provision of the employment licence and residence permit and consequently engagement. It is furthermore being clarified that, the pre-employment medical examination, relevant investigations and the attainment of the employment licence are compulsory prior to the start of the employment / training and prospective candidates should allow enough time to settle everything **PRIOR** to the start of the programme which is expected to be the **12th July 2027**.

5.6 The engagement of successful candidates who are not citizens of Malta, or who are not citizens of the European Union, with the exception of citizens of Croatia, would necessitate an employment licence in so far as this is required by the Immigration Act and subsidiary legislation. Issue of an employment licence will depend on a satisfactory pre-employment health check. Jobsplus should be consulted as necessary on this issue. In the case of successful candidates who do not hold an employment licence, the application for an employment licence will be done by the employer.

5.7 Applicants must be eligible to take up their due appointment, in terms of 5.1 to 5.6 above, not only by the closing time and date of this call for applications but also on the date of appointment.

Submission of Supporting Documents

6.1 Qualifications and experience claimed must **always** be supported by certificates/transcripts and/or testimonials, copies of which are to be scanned and sent through the Recruitment Portal on <https://recruitment.gov.mt>.

6.2 Original certificates and/or testimonials are to be invariably produced for verification at the interview. Documents presented must be officially translated in the English Language.

Selection Procedure

7.1 Eligible applicants will be assessed by a Selection Board to determine their suitability for the position, which shall include a written **compulsory** Situational Judgement Clinical Test held in person on the Maltese Islands followed by another date for an interview. Failure to attend any part of the process will be considered as withdrawal from the selection process. The maximum mark for this selection process is 100% and the pass mark

is 50%.

7.2 Due consideration will be given to applicants who, besides the requisites indicated in paragraphs 5.1 to 5.7, have proven relevant work experience.

Submission of Applications

8.1 Applications are to be submitted, for the attention of the People Management Directorate, Office of the Deputy Prime Minister and Ministry for Health, 15, Palazzo Castellania, Merchants Street, Valletta VLT 1711, through the Online Government Recruitment Portal **only** at the following address: <https://recruitment.gov.mt>. Applications are to include a Curriculum Vitae, completely up-to-date (which should include a list of qualifications held by applicant and the employment history). The closing date of the receipt of applications is **1.30 pm (Central European Time) of Monday 14th September, 2026**. A computer-generated email will be sent as an acknowledgement of the application. Further details concerning the submission of applications are contained in the general provisions referred to below.

8.2 It is the responsibility of the applicants not to leave until the last moment for submission of their application.

8.3 Applications which are received after closing date and time (i.e. late applications) are not allowed.

8.4 Applicants are granted up to two (2) working days after closing date and time of this call for applications, to submit any incorrect or incomplete or missing documents.
